

Isabelle Huppert: Lumière Award 2024

Isabelle Huppert is among the most famous and celebrated French actresses in the world. Her career encompasses an immense part of the history of contemporary cinema. She has collaborated with auteurs from all corners of the globe, from preeminent French filmmakers like Claude Chabrol, who directed her in seven features, Jean-Luc Godard, Claire Denis, Bertrand Tavernier, Diane Kurys or Maurice Pialat, to leading figures in European cinema such as Joseph Losey, Marco Ferreri or Michael Haneke. She has received the Best Actress award twice at the Cannes Film Festival, for her roles in *Violette* and *The Piano Teacher*. She headlined the thriller *Elle* directed by Paul Verhoeven, garnering a César for Best Actress (21 years after winning for Claude Chabrol's *La Cérémonie*), also taking home a Golden Globe and getting an Oscar nod. Her insatiable curiosity has taken her to the United States, where she appeared in Michael Cimino's *Heaven's Gate*, and more recently to the Philippines and South Korea, where she acted under the direction of Brillante Mendoza and Hong Sang-soo. She is a global actress who dazzles both on the big screen and on stage, capable of moving from a sophisticated comedy to a demanding drama - and she never stops filming. The public in Lyon will have the chance to meet this multi-faceted actress and (re)discover, on the big screen, a selection of films that have marked her career.

The Lumière Award, created by Thierry Frémaux in 2009, is presented every year in Lyon, the birthplace of the Cinematograph, to a film personality for his or her body of work and their link with the history of cinema.

Fred Zinnemann, *From Here to Eternity*

Zinnemann is hardly a household name, and yet... The winner of six Oscars, he gave actors Montgomery Clift, Meryl Streep or Marlon Brando (who starred in the sublime motion picture *The Men*) their first roles on the silver screen. Born into the Viennese bourgeoisie at the turn of the century, Zinnemann started out as an assistant cameraman in 1930s Germany, participating in *People on Sunday* (*Menschen am Sonntag*, 1930) alongside Robert Siodmak, Edgar G. Ulmer and Billy Wilder. In the triumphant years of 1952 and 1953, he enjoyed towering success with *High Noon*, directing Gary Cooper and Grace Kelly, and the epic *From Here to Eternity*, starring one of the most illustrious casts of the day: Burt Lancaster, Deborah Kerr, Montgomery Clift and Frank Sinatra. After several more personal films, he encountered major acclaim once more in 1966 with *A Man for All Seasons*, an evocation of the life of Thomas More, which earned him another Academy Award. In 1977, Zinnemann went on to direct Jane Fonda (laureate of the 2018 Lumière Award) and Vanessa Redgrave in the historical saga *Julia*. For his final film, in 1982, he directed Sean Connery in *Five Days One Summer* alongside Lambert Wilson. Fred Zinnemann's name will forever be associated with the great history of classic American movies, of which he was one of its finest masters. It is a pleasure to revisit the œuvre of this humanist filmmaker.

The retrospective will feature the presence of Lambert Wilson, who worked with Fred Zinnemann on two occasions: a first role in *Julia*, then in *Five Days One Summer*, the director's last film. Toshiro Mifune: *From Akira Kurosawa to John Boorman*

This retrospective pays homage to the most famous actor of Japanese cinema, Toshiro Mifune. Mifune was born in then Japanese-occupied China and was twenty when he arrived in Japan in 1940. During WWII, he worked as an Imperial Air Force photographer in charge of taking portraits of kamikaze soldiers. With ambitions of becoming an assistant cameraman, he applied to the powerful Toho Co., but after winning the "New Faces" contest, the casting department called upon him... Mifune would meet Akira Kurosawa a few months later. In an exultant sixteen films, including some of the maestro's finest masterpieces such as *Drunken Angel*, *Rashomon*, *Yojimbo* and *Seven Samurai*, the collaboration between Akira Kurosawa and Toshiro Mifune became the stuff of legends. The filmmaker relied on the actor's physical presence to bring his heroes to life, while exploiting his comedic potential. In 1963, bolstered by the worldwide fame he had acquired thanks to *Rashomon*, Mifune founded his own production company, directed his one and only film, and embarked upon an international career to star in works by Terence Young or John Frankenheimer. In the movie *Hell in the Pacific*, a masterpiece by John Boorman, Mifune gave an outstanding performance opposite Lee Marvin. Mifune's signature character of the vagabond warrior in *Yojimbo* inspired the figure of the lone cowboy, notably incarnated by Clint Eastwood in Sergio Leone's *A Fistful of Dollars*.

Permanent history of women filmmakers: Matilde Landeta

Legend has it that, in order to get the role of 'first assistant', a profession usually reserved for men, Mexican Matilde Landeta arrived on a movie set dressed in a man's suit and sporting a false moustache, speaking in a deep voice to call for silence on the set. After this brazen display, the local cinema authorities agreed to a change their profile for the woman who had been a sought-after screenwriter.

Born into a relatively affluent family in 1913, Matilde Landeta discovered the cinema when her brother, Eduardo, became an actor. Her ambition to become a director was a constant struggle, full of betrayals and insults, such as the banker who entrusted the script she had just penned to another filmmaker, knowing Landeta had wanted to take the directing helm herself... or the distributors who boycotted her début film as director. Her first two films, *Lola Casanova* and *The Black Anguish*, were adaptations of ethnographic author Francisco Rojas Gonzales. The latter was inspired by the true story of a black revolutionary whom the filmmaker was even able to meet. Similar to the motion picture *Trotacalles*, a more classic tale of a confrontation between two sisters set against a backdrop of prostitution, her female protagonists were always the victims of male violence, portrayed by Landeta with a strong feminist consciousness. "Instead of telling the story of women who have been sacrificed," she commented, "I wanted my films to tell the story of women whom I know and whom I consider to be authentic." Matilde Landeta passed away in 1999, after making a final, belated feature film.

Costa-Gavras: Celebration!

On the occasion of the 15 editions gone by of the festival, filmmaker Costa-Gavras will be Lumière's guest of honour at the opening ceremony. The auteur of a multitude of politically engaged films and president of the Cinémathèque française, he will be celebrated for his essential œuvre, which has impacted entire generations. Costa-Gavras' filmography echoes the history of a tormented century. Born in Greece in 1933, his films bear witness to a chaotic world. From the rise of totalitarianism to the current crises, from the collapse of communism to the excesses of globalised capitalism, Costa-Gavras's works tackle the political turmoil of past and present. A director still hard at work, he continues to make films and will be premiering his new feature *Last Breath*. Moreover, his political cinema is the focus of a series by Edwy Plenel, called *The Costa-Gavras Century*. Three episodes will be revealed at the Lumière Film Festival. Celebrations, a master class, film screenings... long live Costa-Gavras!

It was perhaps for *Cinema Paradiso*, at the 1988 Cannes Film Festival, that the expression 'Palme of the heart' was coined, so deeply did this remembrance of a childhood in the cinema touch the public. It even took home the Academy Award for Best Foreign Picture. Since then, maestro Tornatore has been alternating between fiction films and documentaries, evoking his country in *Everybody's Fine*, and celebrating a national treasure, Ennio... Morricone, of course.

Alejandro Jodorowsky All-Nighter at the Institut Lumière

An all-nighter experience to fully celebrate the magician of underground cinema with three gems: a western of mystical initiation, a psychedelic opus tinged with surrealism, and a hallucinatory trip towards immortality. Dive into Alejandro Jodorowsky's tormented, libertine universe, in his presence.

30 years of Queen Margot

An entire generation was forever impacted by the bloody, horrific depiction of the St. Bartholomew's Day massacre in *Queen Margot*, written for the screen by Danièle Thompson. Now, 30 years later, witness one of Isabelle Adjani's most indelible and powerful performances, accompanied by A-list actors Daniel Auteuil, Jean-Hugues Anglade and Vincent Perez.

Memories of Alain Delon

He was one of the most emblematic faces of French cinema of all time. Alain Delon played many legendary roles, boasting a prolific filmography of almost 80 works. Two movies in the festival lineup feature Delon, giving audiences a perfect opportunity to remember the actor who passed away this year.

Yannick Bellon centenary

She was a daring filmmaker, editor, scriptwriter and producer. Yannick Bellon combined all her talents, using her movies to relate the story of people's consciousness, struggles and destinies. Lumière will screen one fiction feature and one documentary film by Bellon.

Yasuzo Masumura, extasy and agony

A precursor of the Japanese New Wave, Yasuzo Masumura directed over fifty films. Saturated images, unapologetic graphic violence, subversion; Lumière will screen a trio of major films by this cult director, restored in 4K. Fans can also look forward to the rerelease of seven Masumura films on video in October and in movie theatres in the spring of 2025 thanks to The Jokers Films.





A festival of solidarity and commitment

A festival for everyone

Every year, the Lumière Film Festival participates in the Integration Week with the Rhône Prefecture and the Regional council by recruiting around fifty refugees into its teams of volunteers. The initiative, which begins from the month of September, and continues after the festival, encourages the practice of the French language, the creation of links with the region and the acquisition and application of specific skills with the aim of professional integration.

The festival also helps vulnerable individuals: Young people on the margins of society, people caught up in the justice system, people with physical or mental disabilities, people on the Autism spectrum, people with eating disorders and people who are excluded from the labour market. This initiative encourages involvement and access to culture and is complemented by a jobdating event thanks to the Adéquat group.

To ensure that as many people as possible can attend festival screenings, two screenings will be accessible for the deaf and hearing-impaired and one will be available in audio-description, indicated in the programme as ST-SME and AD.

Moreover, the master class held by Costa-Gavras will also include a sign language interpreter.

Screenings in prison establishments

A guest of the festival will introduce a film at the Lyon-Corbas prison, and a selection of films from the festival lineup will be screened daily to detainees at nearly a dozen prison establishments in the region.

The cinema at the hospital

Lumière movie screenings are held in partnership with the Rêve de Cinéma for children, adolescents, their accompanying parents, seniors, or young adults suffering from eating disorders. These screenings will be introduced by various guests of the festival at the Woman-Mother-Child Hospital, the Résidence Tête d'Or (establishment for dependent elderly people), the Léon Bérard Centre (Institute of Paediatric Haematology and Oncology) and the Clinic of Saint Vincent de Paul. A young patient of the Léon Bérard Centre will also be able to 'attend' the Opening night and the Lumière Award presentation ceremony, thanks to an 'Awabot' telepresence robot.

The Remake of *Leaving the Lumière Factories*

On 19 March 1895, Louis and Auguste Lumière shot the first film with the Cinématographe, *Leaving the Lumière Factories*, on chemin Saint-Victor, opposite the family factory.

Every year, during the festival, a remake of this first film in the history of cinema is made on the very spot where the Lumière brothers first turned the crank, on what has been rebaptised Rue du Premier-Film (First Film Street).

A movie theatre dedicated to classic cinema

Throughout the year, under the Hangar du Premier-Film you will find daily screenings, retrospectives, cinema classics, festivals, meetings with film personalities, lectures and programmes for children, film-concerts, surprise screenings, cinema all-nighters.

The Lumière Cinemas: a trio of art house theatres

Three historic movie theatres screen a wide variety of national releases all year round on a total of 10 screens in downtown Lyon. *Lumière Terraux*: 40 rue du Pdt E. Herriot, Lyon 1st / *Lumière Bellecour*: 12 rue de la Barre, Lyon 2nd / *Lumière Fourmi*: 68 rue P. Corneille, Lyon 3rd

The Lumière Museum

Louis and Auguste Lumière invented the Cinematograph in Lyon in the Monplaisir district. The exhibitions of the Lumière Museum are housed in the family Villa, featuring various technological advances that led to the invention of the Cinematograph, giving the visitor a fascinating glimpse into how the Lumière films were made.

A cinema library

Founded by historian Raymond Chirat, it is located on the 3rd floor of the Villa Lumière (by appointment only).

Premier-Film Bookstore and DVD shop

Facing the Hangar du Premier-Film, the bookstore is entirely dedicated to the themes of cinema and photography and boasts over 3,000 books and magazines and more than 4,000 DVD/BR titles.

The Lumière café - restaurant

From Tuesday through Sunday, the café serves lunch or dinner, with sweet and savoury choices to suit all tastes, as well as a selection of drinks and cinema wines. Enjoy the terrace when the weather is fine!

The Photo Gallery

The Institut Lumière gallery is dedicated to cinema photography and exhibitions of collectors' posters. On Rue du Premier-Film, it is housed in the former warehouse of the Lumière Factory, next to the bookstore.

Events

Sport, Literature and Cinema Festival: The festival explores the link between sport, literature, fiction films and documentaries. Every winter, it invites auteurs, filmmakers and athletes and features a bookstore of sport-themed publications.

Also: The Jacques Deray Prize, new versions of *Leaving the Factories*, film-concerts at the Auditorium of Lyon, outdoor summer screenings in Cinemascope...

Publishing

The Institut Lumière manages a collection with publishing house Actes Sud and issues books on the cinema, biographies and interviews of filmmakers such as Delphine Seyrig, Alfred Hitchcock, John Ford, Françoise Dorléac..... Some fifty titles are currently available. The Institut Lumière also publishes the monthly cinema review *Positif*.

The collections

The mission of the Institut Lumière is to preserve cinematographic heritage worldwide. It houses a large collection of 35mm and 16mm prints, as well as "non-film" material (books, photographs, posters, scripts...), making it one of the premiere archival film libraries in France.

Educational activities

50,000 schoolchildren and students are welcomed every year to participate in film lessons, interactive workshops, guided screenings, image education activities, and more. Customised programmes are also available for community organisations.
